SYNOPSIS

Count Ripaverde, has recently purchased their village and has moved in nearby. He and his servant, the foppish Don Fabio, encounter Sandrina and, without knowing that she is already married, the Count attempts to woo her.

Don Fabio then tries to court Sandrina behind his master's back. When Berto returns with gardener Menico, they encounter Fabio at the door of the house. They confront him and want to know why he is there.

The Count's fiancée Ernesta arrives. The Count has abandoned her. When the Count returns with Fabio, he tries to find out who she is, when Berto, who has been hiding, steps forward and declares that Sandrina is his sister. The Count, relieved at this, announces his intention to marry Sandrina.

She makes a plan and enlists the help of Ernesta and Menico. She invites the Count to meet her before the wedding when she will make the place very dark, she tells Menico to invite Berto to the same place, but hide him in closet. In the confusion, she exchanges places with Ernesta. In the end the men are taught a lesson and the opera concludes with a happy ending for all.
