BIOGRAPHIES

BRENDA DANIELS

Brenda Daniels is the Associate Dean for the School of Dance at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts (UNCSA) and is the Betsy Friday Distinguished Professor of Contemporary Dance. Prior to joining the faculty at UNCSA in 1995, she created for and toured with her own dance company and received choreographic fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts and the New York Foundation for the Arts. She taught for many years at the Merce Cunningham Studio in New York City and at the American Dance Festival in Durham. She earned a B.F.A. in Dance from Purchase College and an M.F.A in Dance from Hollins University. She is the proud mother of Ruthie Dalby, alumna of the UNCSA high school ballet program.

SAMUEL HAN

Samuel Han is a sixteen-year-old pianist from Charlotte, North Carolina. Han has always loved music but only began seriously studying at 12, after hearing a classical piece performed at a school talent show. From then, he became enamored by classical repertoire and the performances of the great pianists, availing himself of whatever musical opportunities he could get his hands on.

He has performed at nursing homes and other public venues and has received masterclasses from distinguished soloists such as Alexander Kobrin and Jose Ramon Mendez. He has also attended multiple summer music festivals such as the Palmetto International Piano Festival (2021) and the East Carolina Piano Festival (2021). His recent competition winnings include first prize in the Charlotte Piano Teachers Forum Concerto Competition (2021), honorable mention in the Charlotte Symphony Young Artists Competition (2022), and second prize in the Peter Perret Youth Talent Search Concerto Competition (2022).

Han is currently studying piano and theory under Dmitri Vorobiev and receives occasional lessons from Paul Nitsch. When not at the piano, Samuel enjoys languages, reading, math and competitive swimming.

MARIANA OLIVEIRA

Originally from Brazil, Mariana Oliveira studied at the Royal Academy of Dance in London and was a trainee dancer at the National Dance Company of Wales.

She has created new works for the New York City Ballet Choreographic Institute, Joffrey Ballet Winning Works, Kansas City Ballet, Carolina Ballet, BalletX, Ballet Memphis, Richmond Ballet, Dayton Ballet, Milwaukee Ballet, Madison Ballet, National Choreographers Initiative, Ballet Arkansas, The University of Oklahoma School of Dance, among others. Oliveira is a recipient of the NYU Center for Ballet and the Arts Fellowship, as well the Kansas City University Choreographic Fellowship. Oliveira is the founder of The Union Project Dance Company, where her works were presented at the Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, McCallum Theatre Choreography Festival, LA Dance Festival and Avery Fisher Hall at Lincoln Center.

Anthony Lee Bryant is a native of Jonesville, North Carolina. He studied with Pamela Myers Wurdeman's Academy of Dance Arts and Performance in Elkin, N.C. before being accepted into the UNCSA School of Dance high school program. He later attended The American Musical and Dramatic Academy in New York City and eventually earned his B.F.A. from The Juilliard School.

He has danced with Azure Barton and Artists, Jacob Jonas The Company and LA Dance Project where he danced pieces by Martha Graham, Merce Cunningham, William Forsythe, Benjamin Millepied, Bobbi Jene Smith, Justin Peck, Janie Taylor and more. Bryant has toured nationally and internationally with dance companies and musical theater productions including, "The Lion King," "Peter Pan with Cathy Rigby" and "Wicked." He has been asked to choreograph for music videos, dance films and now he is excited to be creating "Entropy" on UNCSA's M3 class for Fall Dance 2022.

THE SCHOOL OF DANCE



A world-class, resident faculty is complemented by visiting guest artists, choreographers, and company residencies that bring current trends from the field. Students concentrate in either classical ballet or contemporary dance, but train and perform in both. Numerous performance opportunities allow students to explore a diverse repertory.

THE SCHOOL OF DESIGN AND PRODUCTION

Unlike other schools that incorporate design and production within theatre studies programs, the School of Design and Production is a highly regarded, independent conservatory. The school is ranked #3 in the nation. Employing a resident faculty of experienced professionals, the school offers a comprehensive curriculum in every aspect of modern stagecraft, from scene design to stage management. Students gain practical experience working on a variety of productions inside theaters of all styles and sizes, and within 100,000 square feet of production space.
