The second concert will feature guest artists Jennifer Frautschi, violin, and Clive Greensmith, cello, joined by students and faculty-artists in works by Mozart. Dvořák and Schumann. The newly launched Chamber Music Festival offers invaluable opportunities to students to perform alongside faculty and renowned artists of today, and an intimate and rewarding experience for audiences.

Guest Artist Dominik Wagner, **Double Bass, in Recital** Oct. 29 at 3 p.m.

UNCSA presents the stunning virtuosity and passionate musicianship of 25-year-old Viennese double bassist Dominik Wagner as part of his first North American tour. Wagner is a winner of multiple competitions, including the ECHO Classic Award, International Bradetich Competition, ARD Music Competition and the Eurovision Young Musicians Competition. This past year he was named an Anne-Sophie Mutter scholarship winner, and he has performed frequently with the legendary violinist. UNCSA faculty member Allison Gagnon will collaborate on piano.
